News from our E.P., Kevin Keaton

OGHS 2.1

For many people in the pew, OGHS means “Oh God! Here’s the Spiel” as someone from some committee **reads** something from a bulletin insert that the listener plainly could have read! It is a routine repeated offering after offering in church after church, year after year. Truly inspiring, isn’t it?

If leaders want to spare their congregations (and themselves) from such a scenario, if pastors would like to realize greater participation, if elders would appreciate a better understanding of what the offering is all about, then a few simple steps may assist in changing the way your church views and participates in the One Great Hour of Sharing.

Step One – Spend ten minutes *actually reading* information about the OGHS so you are familiar with the offering. The fastest, simplest way to do this is online at <http://www.pcusa.org/oghs/index.htm>

Are you aware that One Great Hour of Sharing funds are divided among its three programs: Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (32%), Self-Development of People (32%), and Presbyterian Hunger Program (36%).

Did you know that Churches and individuals can change the percentage distribution of the offering between the three programs if they wish. The following are the special Account numbers used for program designated One Great Hour of Sharing receipts.

OG100000 - Presbyterian Disaster Assistance

OG200000 - Self Development of People

OG300000 - Presbyterian Hunger Program

Step Two – Spend five minutes Send an e-mail to your congregation about the offering. You might include the link to the OGHS website.

Step Three – Spend five minutes to show the brief Power Point presentation to your session, deacons, or congregation. Download the .ppt at http://www.pcusa.org/oghs/OGHS_automatic.ppt

In less than thirty minutes, you may have an impact on the way your church family perceives and responds to the One Great Hour of Sharing.

Position Description:

To serve in ministry Latino/Hispanic people in South Omaha, NE particularly around the Castelar Presbyterian Church. He or she should possess the following skills:

- be fluent in Spanish and English
- be willing and able to strengthen youth and family ministries—particularly the monthly neighborhood Kid's Night
- identify and respond to the social, health, and economic needs of the neighborhood.
- lead worship services in Spanish and English
- have experience in, training, or at least an interest in community organizing.

Site Information: Castelar Presbyterian Church is an historic "immigrant congregation". For many years it served German then Czech people who settled in South Omaha. It once was a thriving congregation with the largest Sunday School in the state. Currently, membership has dwindled to 30-40 aging members. Seven years ago, "The Four Old White Guys", founded a monthly social evening (Kid's Night) for nearby predominately Mexican heritage girls and boys. Most evenings there are games, children's worship, and pizza. Recently, we have been blessed with 60+ children most evenings. Our congregational members have a strong desire to support a third transformation in becoming a neighborhood congregation again. With the prayful and financial support of Missouri Valley Presbytery, sister congregations, and many supportive individuals we would like to become a bilingual and bicultural congregation once again.
