# PMRV Committee and Commission Reports For November 3, 2022 Stated Meeting of the Presbytery

### Social Justice and Peacemaking - Rev. Carolyn Grice, Chair

- Present: Sandi Hannah, Bob Keefer, Greg Carlson, Nicole Geiler, Shelli Latham, Kevin Bushnell, Carolyn Grice and guest Aledia Mikale.
- Carolyn welcomed everyone and opened with prayer.
- Carolyn announced that the next meeting, Nov 1<sup>st</sup>, would be held jointly with Mission/Evangelism, FELD and SDOP. Rev. Dr. Alonzo Johnson from the PCUSA Mission Agency will present information on Matthew 25 and SDOP.
- Presentation-Aledia Mikale from the Omaha Black Doulas Association provided information on this program.
  - They currently have 13 black doulas in Omaha, one Latino and are looking for a Korean
  - o The need is strong for representation in medical services in the Omaha area for people of color
  - The services the organization provides are free to the clients
  - Their focus in on nutrition where they have a garden and teach gardening skills
  - They have a diaper drive and giveaways with 60-100 families. They can provide diaper trade-ins, where if a mom has unused diapers, she can trade them for the next size up
  - The group conducts a community baby shower. They usually find their clients through these community showers. They have presenters, discuss prenatal visits, vaccinations, gestational diabetes; help mothers create birth plans (mothers have the power of choice to determine the type of birth they want); they are taught comfort techniques (also teach techniques to the spouse or support person).
  - O Doulas are present through labor and delivery. They are present through the first hour after delivery. They teach breastfeeding techniques and provide post-partum care. While they recognize they are not medically certified to do anything when red flags occur, they can alert the client to seek medical help right away. They help get the home set up for a newborn and stay around for 3-6 weeks, one hour/week after the birth.
  - O What can churches do to help?
    - Donate whatever they can financially
    - Help recruit more doulas
    - Provide venues for community baby showers
    - Can also donate things like diapers through their Amazon page.
- Palestine Update-Sandi Hannah shared information about Palestine and information from this last GA
  regarding the status. The GA acted declaring Israel an apartheid state. It took ten years to get this statement
  implemented. Amnesty International has also done this. A community fundraiser with St. Timothy's ELCA
  Church on 93<sup>rd</sup> & Dodge in Omaha coming up. It will support two programs for youth in Palestine.
- Kevin Bushnell shared that a new GA committee has been created addressing Christian Zionism. It will be working with other faith organizations to understand the realities and dangers of Zionism in the western hemisphere, particularly helping Palestinians in South America. Zionism is being directly driven by Israel.
- Afghanistan Update-Kevin shared that there are not as many refugees as there were last spring although they continue to arrive in the Metro area. Efforts are underway to help them help themselves through a nonprofit organization.
- Kevin provided the closing prayer at 12:22pm. Next meeting: November 1<sup>st</sup>, 11:30.

The committee has been meeting via email. Two applications have been submitted. Work is being done to review and submit for approval. The organizations have been encouraged to also submit an application at the synod level. More details will be provided next month.

- As Calvin Crest engages in the busiest fall in three years, we are reminded of the importance of what this
  place represents in the lives of the children, youth and adults who spend time here. As participants gather for
  their event, they often feel the stress of life lessen and are filled with the calm that comes in dedicating some
  time to faith development, community building and holy rest. The staff at Calvin Crest strives to develop the
  facilities and atmosphere that enables this to happen.
- The Board of Directors is engaged in the ministry and seeking the future direction that Calvin Crest needs to move towards to continue to provide a place of spiritual nourishment, replenishment, and development for those who seek this in their lives.
- With so much happening in the world, we all need a little of what Calvin Crest offers.

### Faith Education Leadership Development – Rev. Cindy Harvey, chair

The Worship & Spirituality Committee met on September 29, 2022. We planned worship for the November 3 presbytery meeting on zoom. We're also planning several upcoming discussion groups and theological events for PMRV.

### Mission and Evangelism - Rev. Matt Coplen, Chair

- Our most recent meeting was held on Tuesday, October 4<sup>th</sup>. We met in the Fellowship Hall of New Life
  Presbyterian Church of Omaha, where we saw the amazing Bible-inspired murals painted by the
  congregation on the walls. Carolyn Grice gave us some history of the congregation and some of the mission
  work evident just looking around.

- The committee approved a mini-grant request of \$2,000 from Villisca Presbyterian Church for the community's food pantry that is supported to a great extent by the Presbyterian Church.
- The committee approved a Matthew 25 Partnership gift of \$650 for New Life Presbyterian Church to help with their Saturday morning food giveaways. The money will be used to offer hot chocolate, coffee and hot soup to community members as they wait in line for food and other assistance.
- Following our meeting, the committee made a couple of decisions by email related to conversations that were held during the meeting:
  - We approved a gift of \$650 to "A Place at the Table" a five-congregation mission project of the churches in Shenandoah, Iowa. "A Place at the Table" is a once a month meal for anyone and everyone and there is also a guest speaker invited who shares other avenues for assistance within the community.
  - We approved a gift of \$200 to "Hand-up for Housing" to further the efforts of several presbytery congregations to offer assistance in the area of affordable housing.
  - The committee is currently receiving Komarek Trust grant applications. Our next committee meeting will be November 7<sup>th</sup> at Discovery Presbyterian Church at 1:00 p.m. We anticipate that a financial representative of the Komarek Trust will join us by zoom to discuss the applications and make recommendations to the Trust. NOTES TO STATEMENT OF CASH RECEIPTS AND DISBURSEMENTS For The Year Ended December 31, 2021

### 1. Nature of Business

Presbytery of Missouri River Valley (the Presbytery) was formed to conduct ministry and mission works for the Synod of Lakes and Prairies of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). It serves as an intermediary body between local churches and the Synod of Lakes and Prairies of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.).

The Presbytery is supported primarily through contributions from individual member churches. Approximately 80% of the Presbytery's budgeted cash receipts for the year ended December 31, 2021 came from these member churches.

### 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

### A. Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statement has been prepared on the cash receipts and disbursements basis of accounting. Under that basis, the only asset recognized is cash, and no liabilities are recognized. All transactions are recognized as either cash receipts or disbursements, and noncash transactions are not recognized. Property improvements and equipment are expensed as costs are incurred and not capitalized and depreciated over their estimated useful lives. The statement of cash receipts and disbursements does not include certain transactions that would be included if Presbytery of Missouri River Valley prepared its financial statements on the accrual basis of accounting, in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. Accordingly, the statements of cash receipts and disbursements are not intended to present financial position or results of operations in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

### **B.** Income Tax Status

Presbytery of Missouri River Valley is exempt from income taxation pursuant to Section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code as an organization described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Accordingly, no income taxes are included in these financial statements.

### C. <u>Use of Estimates</u>

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the cash receipts and disbursements basis of accounting requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

# D. <u>Concentrations of Credit Risk Arising From Cash Deposits in Excess of Insured Limits</u>

The Presbytery maintains cash balances at several financial institutions in the Omaha area. Accounts at each of these institutions are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation up to \$250,000. At December 31, 2021, the Presbytery had no uninsured cash balances.

### 3. Cash and Cash Equivalents

The Presbytery considers all highly liquid investments with maturities of three months or less when purchased to be cash equivalents. Cash and cash equivalents at December 31, 2021, consist of checking and money market accounts:

### 6. Pension Plan

The Presbytery is a participating employer in the pension plan administered through the Board of Pensions of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). The Presbytery contributes a fixed percentage of compensation to this plan for qualifying individuals. For non-clerical employees the Presbytery contributes to a 403(b) tax deferred annuity. For the twelve months ended December 31, 2021, employee benefit expense was \$6,630. This amount includes pension and annuity expense, medical, life and disability insurance premiums.

### 7. Contingencies

The Presbyterian Church Investment and Loan Program granted funds to Missouri River Valley churches between the years 1914 and 1933. These old mortgage grants include language stating that no payment of principal or interest is due so long as the congregation remains a part of the PC (USA). If a congregation sells their building, ceases to exist or leave the denomination, the principal with interest is due prior to being dismissed. Currently there are 8 of these grants totaling \$51,413. These congregations remain in PC (USA) and Missouri Valley. Thus, no repayments of the mortgage grant, or any other action is required by Missouri River Valley Presbytery.

### 8. Subsequent Events

Subsequent events have been evaluated through September 22, 2022, the date that the financial statements were available for issue.

### Westminster Final Report – October 25, 2022

The session of Westminster Presbyterian Church of Omaha held its final session meeting on September 8, 2022. Present were moderator Rev. Portia Iverson, session members Richard Kropp, Susan Kropp, Gary Raftery, Tom Reischlein, Clerk of Session Gary Tupper, and Commission on Ministry members Sally Carlson and Dwight Williams.

The official dissolution date of the congregation was September 30, 2022 which was approved by the congregation on April 10, 2022 and approved by PMRV on August 13, 2022.

The original closing date on the property was September 30, 2022, but the purchaser CityLight Mosaic requested a 1-month extension in order to get their finances in order. Presbytery Attorney Michael O'Bradovich prepared an extension agreement which transferred liability, insurance, etc. to CityLight on October 1, 2022, and moved the property sale closing date to October 31, 2022. Westminster session approved the extension on September 8.

The presbytery and congregation thank the Rev. Portia Iverson for her service and for her skill in guiding the congregation through this process.

The session graciously extended employees' compensation through October 31st,

The Treasurer of Westminster Presbyterian will stay in place until the end of January 2023, in order to finish paying bills and issuing documents such as W-2s and 1099s. Any remaining funds will be entrusted to the Presbytery of Missouri River Valley for final disposition.

After months of deliberations and making arrangements, the disposition of the property is as follows:

- Pertinent documents and records are being sent to PMRV or to the Presbyterian Historical Society.
- The pipe organ is being donated to Joslyn Castle, with removal and transportation at Joslyn Castle's expense.
- Hardwood Chancel furnishings (pulpit, lectern, rail, etc.) hymnals and communion ware have been moved to storage at Plattsmouth Presbyterian with the hope that they may eventually be donated to a church somewhere that has been destroyed by a natural disaster.
- Proceeds of the \$410,000 building sale are being distributed in the following amounts:
  - o \$175,000 to Camp Calvin Crest
  - o \$175,000 to New Life Presbyterian Church
  - \$39,800 to pay student loans of four recent seminary and theological students (paid directly to the institutions)
- The Westmareeners Fund and the White Christmas Fund monies were distributed to the Underwood Hills Presbyterian Food Pantry.
- There are a couple of permanent/endowment funds that are being handled by our Presbytery Attorney to make sure that these endowed funds are transferred legally.
- After all of the remaining bills are paid, the existing balance in the checking account will be transferred to the PMRV. The final amount will not be known until early January 2023, but it should be in the neighborhood of ~\$40,000.

There may be a few other items which are not be listed here, but those would be only minor oversights on my part, not anything of any size or significance.

As of September 30, 2022, the membership of 32 members of Westminster have been transferred to the Presbytery for custody until they move their membership to another congregation.
